Ann M. Hellman passed away November 12, 2013 in Bismarck. Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 10:30 Saturday, November 16, at Church of St. Anne, Bismarck, with Rev. Corey Nelson officiating. Burial will be in St. Mary's Cemetery, Bismarck. Visitation will be held from 5:00 pm – 8:00 pm Friday, November 15, at Eastgate Funeral Service, Bismarck, where a rosary will begin at 7:00 pm. Visitation will continue one hour prior to the service at the church. Ann Margaret Schaff was born April 16, 1916, at Ryegate, Montana, to Adam and Veronica Emter Schaff. She moved with her family in 1925, to the St. Joseph area, south of Glen Ullin, and attended school in Grant County. Ann married Marcus Hellman at St. Joseph's Church on November 25, 1941, and together they raised their family in Glen Ullin, where Mark worked at the public schools. They enjoyed square dancing and playing cards with relatives and friends. Ann was active in Christian Mothers and Homemakers, and as a 4-H leader.

In 1974, Ann and Mark moved to Bismarck, where Mark was employed at St. Anne's School. After Mark retired in 1986, they did volunteer work, including time at the Baptist Home. Mark passed away March 23, 1993. Ann later became a resident of Evergreen Manor, near Bismarck, where she was cared for by Margaret and Erv Schadler. Ann became a resident of the Baptist Home in Bismarck in June 2012, where she resided until her death.

Her faith in God and love of her family were the most important things in Ann's life. She is survived by her children Jane Seger Phillip, Carol Felix Fettig,
