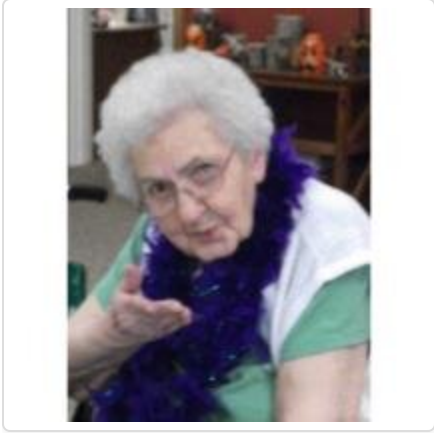




Anna Kinev

January 21, 1922 - February 27, 2015

Anna Kinev, 93, Bismarck, passed away peacefully February 27, 2015, at Sanford St. Vincent Continuing Care Center in Bismarck. A memorial service will be held at 1:00 pm Wednesday, March 4, 2015, at Parkway Funeral Service, 2330 Tyler Parkway, Bismarck. A vigil service will be held at 7:00 pm Tuesday, March 3, 2015, at Parkway Funeral Service, Bismarck. Private family burial will be held at a later date at Dawson Cemetery. Anna was born January 21, 1922, to Marie and Vasilli Balabon south of Dawson, ND. She spent her early childhood on a farm just five miles as the crow flies, from her future husband, even though they never knew each other. After losing her father early in her life, a stepfather moved the family to Medina, then Plainfield, Iowa. She grew up in the Waterloo area and graduated high school there.

After graduation, she worked in a photo shop, and later at Rath's Meat Packing Plant, where she was working when she met her husband of almost 63 years. Anna met Ben Kinev in late 1946 when he was visiting the area with his older sister, who had come to visit older siblings of Anna's. They were married in Waterloo on January 3, 1947. Anna returned to Ben's family farm near Dawson where she helped him farm for the next 30 years. They retired to a home in Steele, N.Dak., while Ben continued to operate Kinev's Seed House in Tappen. Anna enjoyed gardening, reading and word search books. She and Ben also enjoyed dancing, which they did every Saturday night until aching joints no longer allowed the activity. Anna moved to Edgewood Village in

Bismarck in October, 2009, just two months before losing Ben.

She resided there until July, 2014 when she moved to St. Vincent Care Center. Anna is survived by four children, Stephany Roger Thorsness, Tappen; Paulette Ron Voegele, Bismarck; Larry Kim Kinev, Dawson; and Randy Karen Kinev, Dawson; six grandchildren, five great-grandchildren and three step-great grandchildren; as well as many nieces and nephews who live out of state. Memorials may be given to the Dawson Cemetery or Camp Grassick in Dawson.
