Anna Schuler, 94, Bismarck, died November 23, 2003, at a Bismarck care center. Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 2:00 PM at Baptist Home Chapel with Pastor Clyde Liemberer officiating. Burial will be at Mandan Union Cemetery. Visitation will be Tuesday from 3:00 - 9:00 PM at Eastgate Funeral Service where a prayer service will be held on Tuesday at 7:30 PM. Visitation will continue one hour prior to the service at the Baptist Home. Anna Lang was born on August 2, 1909, in Hague, North Dakota, the daughter of Jacob and Rose Ladner Lang. The family farmed at Hosmer, South Dakota, and later moved to Eureka, South Dakota, where they continued to farm and where Anna attended rural schools. On February 23, 1932, Anna married Theodore Schuler in Eureka. They moved to Linton, North Dakota, where they farmed. In 1935, they moved to Underwood, North Dakota, where they farmed and Theodore also worked in the Coal Mines. In 1943, they moved to Mandan, North Dakota, where Theodore worked on the railroad until he retired in 1970. In 1972, Theodore died. Anna was a homemaker and caretaker of elderly ladies in her home until her husband died. In 1973, she moved to Bismarck. In 1992, she entered the Baptist Home and lived there until her death. She was a member of Faith Lutheran Church and a member of the Friendship Circle. Anna loved to sing and always had a smile on her face.
