March 30, 1936 - July 7, 2009

Beverly Fae Schwartz, 73, Bismarck, formerly of Fargo, passed away July 7, 2009, at her home with her family at her side after fighting a courageous battle with ovarian cancer. Mass of Christian burial will be held at 10:30 am Tuesday at Church of Corpus Christi, Bismarck, with Rev. Paul Becker officiating. Burial will be held at the North Dakota Veteran's Cemetery, Mandan. There will be no visitation, as cremation has taken place. A rosary service will be held at 7:30 pm Monday at Eastgate Funeral Service, 2302 East Divide Avenue, Bismarck. Beverly was born March 30, 1936, in rural Upham, ND, the daughter of August and Lucy Widmayer Zeretzke. Beverly was raised in the home of her parents and received her education in Layton Township country school. After her education, she moved to Bismarck to work at Woolworth's Department Store. She met her future husband, Wendelin "Rocky" Schwartz and they were married on August 2, 1954, at St. Joseph Church in Mandan. They lived in Fargo until retirement in 1982, when they moved to Arizona. During Beverly and Wendelin's retirement they spent their summers in Bismarck and their winters in Glendale, AZ. Beverly loved spending time with her grandchildren; they were her pride and joy. She also enjoyed reading, playing cards, traveling; especially the trips with her sisters, and spending time with family and friends. Beverly was a Past Commander for DAV Auxiliary. She is survived by her husband, Wendelin, Bismarck; her children, Jeffrey, Fargo, Robin Carlotta, Fargo, Daniel Linda, Buckeye, AZ, Lisa Willie Comstock, Savage, MN, and Michelle Haiby, Glendale, AZ; seven grandchildren, Casie,

Chelsey, Nicole, Michael, Jennifer, Christopher, and Matthew; her brother, Bobby; and her sisters, Betty, Ruby, Marlys, Shirley Chuck, Dickie George, Donna Arlo.
