



Borghild Heskin

January 19, 1918 - February 21, 2006

Borghild "Borgie" Heskin, 88, Bismarck, died February 21, 2006, at Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center. Services will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, February 25, at Trinity Lutheran Church, Bismarck, with the Rev. Steve Sathre officiating. Burial will be in Sunset Memorial Gardens. Visitation will be from 2:00 to 9:00 p.m. Friday at Eastgate Funeral Service. Borghild Bodin was born on January 19, 1918, in Cartwright, North Dakota, to the Rev. Konrad and Hannah Halvorson Bodin. The family moved from there to Savage, Montana, Troy, Idaho, and eventually to Minot, North Dakota, where Borgie graduated from high school in 1935. She graduated from Minot Teacher's College and married Orland Heskin in 1937. They started their life together in Alamo, North Dakota, where Orland taught. They also lived in Williston before moving to Bismarck in 1945. After Orland's death in 1956, Borgie taught at Pioneer Grade School for three years before transferring to Will-Moore Grade School and retired in 1980. In retirement, she volunteered at Medcenter One in their Senior Volunteer Program, working in the Radiology Department for over 5,000 hours. Borgie was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church for over 60 years, sang in their adult choir for nearly fifty years, and was a member of a circle during that time. She sang in the annual Handel's Messiah for over forty years, was a piano player for Sunday School and also served as a Luther League advisor. She was a part of two birthday clubs for many, many years where she had dear and caring friends. Borgie is survived by her son, Robert Haroldeen Heskin, Alexandria, Minnesota; her daughter Carolyn Dale

Twingley, Bismarck; two sisters, Signe Silas Langager and Connie Gus Skurdal all of Williston; grandchildren, Jonathan Twingley, Ben Twingley, Robin Paul Vandervoort, and Debra Russell Wolfe; her great-grandchildren, Derek, Kelsie, Trystan, and Mason; as well as nieces and nephews who were also dear to her.
