Clifford A. Kluck, Bismarck, formerly of McClusky, died June 11, 2014, at Baptist Home Inc. Services will be Monday, June 23, at 11:00 a.m. at Evangel Assembly of God in Bismarck with Rev. Wes Glennen officiating. Interment will be at the North Dakota Veteran's Cemetery at 3:00 p.m. Visitation will be Sunday, June 22, from 2:00 – 6:00 p.m. at Parkway Funeral Service, 2330 Tyler Parkway, Bismarck, and will continue one hour prior to the service. Clifford was born March 25, 1929, in the rural area north of McClusky, ND, to Charlie and Katherina Kluck. He weighed 15 pounds at birth. Clifford grew up in a farming community and graduated from McClusky High School in 1949. He attended the Bible and Music Academy in Minot, ND, for one year where he met Eva Crosby. They were married August 15, 1950. He was drafted February 19 for service in the military and spent two years at Fort Worden in Port Townsend, WA, where he achieved the rank of Sergeant First Class. After his discharge, he and Eva returned to the farm. Three boys were born to them: Clive, Craig, and Claude. After 23 years of suffering with allergy problems they decided to sell the farm. Two boys were in college so they moved with Claude to Bismarck. Cliff worked for St Alexius Hospital in the maintenance department; the perfect job for him. Soon it was time for retirement and to enjoy the good life. He decided to restore his 1941 Ford Coupe to its original condition. He traveled to many swap-meets for original parts and when finished, had some fun entering car shows and competition. Too soon, he began to have health problems and was diagnosed with

Parkinson Disease. He battled it at home as long as he could, and then entered the Baptist Home spending 1 ½ years under their care. He leaves behind Eva, his wife of 64 years; three sons, Clive, Aurora, CO., Craig Marcia, Rochester, MN, and Claude Anne, Jacksonville, FL; eight grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren. He was the last of his family to pass but leaves many cousins; four brothers-in-law; four sisters-in-law; and many friends.
