March 8, 1938 - May 12, 2007

Doris J. Hagen Heinle, 69, Bismarck, died May 12, 2007, at Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center after a long battle with multiple sclerosis and recently cancer. Services will be held at 2:00 pm on Friday at Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center, Bismarck, with Rev. Dale Nabben officiating. Graveside services will be at 5:00 pm Friday at the Goodrich Cemetery. Visitation will be held one hour prior to services on Friday at Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center, Bismarck. Doris was born on March 8, 1938, at Goodrich, ND, the daughter of Morris and Vearl Brakel Hagen. She was raised on a farm north of Goodrich, graduating from Goodrich High School in 1955. She then attended Teacher's College in Minot, which began her career as a teacher. Doris taught country school for three and a half years around the Goodrich area. She then moved to Wing, ND, where she continued teaching for another three years at the Tuttle grade school. Doris lived on the family farm in Wing until the summer of 1983 when she moved to Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center. Doris had a real love for animals. She loved her childhood horse, Flash. She loved cats and befriended squirrels at the nursing home. She had one mother squirrel she called, "grandma" who ate peanuts off her lap. Doris was an artist, whom did many oil paintings in her early years; she made hundreds of watercolor cards and recently enjoyed painting rocks. Doris is survived by her daughters, Rebecca Heinle Jacobson of Phoenix, AZ, and Darcy Larry Brooks of Baldwin, ND; her mother, Vearl Hagen of Goodrich, ND; her grandchildren, Christen Heinle, John "JC" Jacobson, and their father, John Jacobson; her

grandchildren, Shania and Bailey Brooks of Baldwin, ND; and her brothers, Dan Hagen and Jon Hagen both of Goodrich, ND. Doris was preceded in death by her father, Morris Hagen.
