March 8, 1943 - April 22, 2005

Dwight Andrew Dronen, 62, Steele, died April 22, 2005. Funeral services will be Wednesday at 10:00 AM at Trinity Lutheran Church in Steele with Rev. Paul Tjostem and Rev. Paul Schauer officiating. Burial will be at Woodlawn Cemetery Visitation will be Tuesday from 11:00 AM - 9:00 PM at Eastgate Steele Chapel where a prayer service will be held at 7:00 PM. Dwight was born on March 8, 1943, in Bismarck, the son of Andrew and Lillian Hall Dronen. He attended school in Clear Lake Township and graduated from Driscoll High School in 1961. He then attended BJC for two years. Dwight married Dianne Janke on August 31, 1963, in Steele. They farmed north of Driscoll until 1980 when they purchased Dianne's parents farm, south of Steele. Dwight had a dairy operation throughout his farming and ranching career until 2001, and then continued with his cattle and grain operation along with his son, Charlie. Dwight also worked faithfully alongside Dianne in her tax office for the past eleven years. He served his community in many ways including the township boards, the school board, and the Trinity Lutheran Church Council. Dwight enjoyed his saddle horse and his dogs. He took pride in his cattle and enjoyed spending time with his family and doing things for his grandchildren. Dwight was a die-hard Democrat with a quick wit and a smile for his friends and the people he met. He is survived by his wife, Dianne of Steele; his daughter, Kim Dronen of Bismarck; his son and daughter-in-law, Tim "Charlie" and Nancy Dronen of Steele; his mother, Lillian Dronen; his grandchildren, Justin, Casey, and Tanner Nagel, Hallie, Payden, and Wyatt
