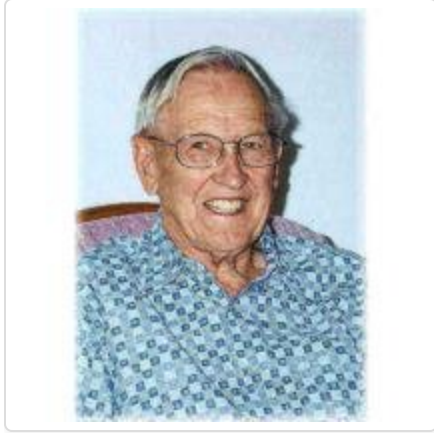




Ernold M Rauser
