



## Freda Redmann

January 13, 1916 - February 8, 2008

Freda Redmann, 92, Bismarck, died February 8, 2008 at a Bismarck care center. Services will be held at 11:00 am Monday at Evangel Assembly of God Church, Bismarck with Rev. Doug Graham officiating. Burial will be in Sunset Memorial Gardens, Bismarck. Visitation will be held from 3:00 pm until 9:00 pm Sunday at Eastgate Funeral Service, Bismarck and continue one hour prior to services at the church. Freda Redmann was born January 13, 1916, at Blue Grass, ND, in Oliver County, to Peter and Katherina Schmierer Mindt. She was raised and educated in that area. On September 29, 1935, Freda was married to Milton Redmann at Blue Grass. Milton died in Bismarck on July 19, 1994. She was a stay-at-home mom who loved to take care of her family. In later years, Freda was employed with the Bismarck Tribune and did babysitting. In their retirement years Freda and Milton enjoyed camping and selling stuffed animals at craft shows.
