Harold Leno, 80, Bismarck, died October 9, 2008, at Medcenter One Hospital. Services will be held at 1:00 PM Saturday at Eastgate Funeral Service Chapel, Bismarck, with Rev. Larry Giese officiating. Burial will be in Sunset Memorial Gardens, Bismarck, with military honors provided by VFW Post #1326. Visitation will be held from 2:00 pm until 9:00 pm Friday at Eastgate Funeral Service and will continue one hour prior to the service. Harold was born August 5, 1928, at Tuttle, ND, the son of Jacob and Caroline Rivinius Leno. He was raised and educated in Tuttle. Harold enlisted in the U.S. Air Force on September 24, 1946. He received his basic training in San Antonio, TX, and served as Decontamination Equipment Operator in Mississippi, Michigan, and Illinois. He was honorably discharged on September 23, 1949. Harold worked in Fargo for a few years before moving to Bismarck. He worked for Northern Pacific Railroad later Burlington Northern for 33 years until his retirement in 1986. He liked to travel, and found great pleasure when he could hunt and fish. Harold is survived by his son, Harold Kirkeby of Fargo, ND; his daughter and son-in-law, Sharon and Greg Misialek of Castle Rock, WA; several grandchildren and great-grandchildren; three brothers and five sisters-in-law, Jacob Leno, Willie and Esther Leno, Pauline Leno, Doris Leno, Linda Leno and Gwen Leno all of Bismarck, ND and Arthur Leno of San Antonio, TX; two sisters and one brother-in-law, Freda and John Jochim of Tacoma, WA and Tilly Quincer of Miles City, MT; and many nieces, nephews and good friends.
