Inez (Hafner) Klaus of Bismarck, ND, died March 21, 2015, at CHI St. Alexius Health, surrounded by her family.

Funeral services will be held on Tuesday at 10:00 AM at Faith Lutheran Church in Bismarck with Rev. Jon Splichal Larson officiating. Burial will be at Sunset Memorial Gardens.

Visitation will be one hour prior to the service at the church.

Inez was born on March 21, 1923, to Theodore and Adelheid (Minnie) Hafner. She grew up on a farm north of Beulah and attended a rural school and graduated from Beulah High School. She later taught rural school in the same area.

Inez married Leroy Klaus from Zap, ND. Leroy and Inez lived in Hazen for a number of years before moving to Bismarck, where they lived the remainder of their lives. Together they had two children, Candace and Curtis. Inez worked at Sakakawea Girl Scouts for over twenty years as a book keeper/office manager. Inez was very active at Faith Lutheran Church, serving in a number of capacities.

Inez is survived by her daughter, Candace (Jerry) Eldridge of Bismarck; her
