Joe Goldade, 89, Bismarck, died January 6, 2009. Mass of Christian burial will be held at 11:00 am Friday at Church of Corpus Christi, Bismarck, with Rev. Paul Becker and Rev. Tom Graner officiating. Visitation will be held from 4:00 pm until 9:00 pm Thursday at Eastgate Funeral Service with a vigil beginning at 7:00 pm. Visitation will continue one hour prior to the service at the church. Joe was born October 24, 1919, the son of Joseph and Theresia Martin Goldade at Hague, ND. He was raised and attended schools in Hague. Joe married Martha Thiele on February 17, 1941, at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Hague. They lived in Hague and Linton where Joe owned and operated a butcher shop. Martha died in 1974 and Joe later moved to Steele and was married to Polly Hoffer. Joe was quite the handyman and helped out at the Golden Manor for many years and drove school bus. He took great pride in his sausage recipes. Joe was full of life and loved fishing, dancing, and playing cards. He truly had a twinkle in his eye and would with great enthusiasm have many adventures with his children as they were growing up. Joe continued the fun with his grandchildren, sharing his love of fishing and hunting. He loved playing with all kids; his grandchildren and great grandchildren being the apple of his eye. He is survived by his daughters, Marie Faulk, CA, Terry DeLong, Garrison, and Rita Goldade, Bismarck; his son, Richard Jeannie Goldade, Lin'o Lakes, MN; 15 grandchildren and 21 great grandchildren; and his sister, Eva Everding, CA. He was preceded in death by 12 brothers and sisters.
