Kurt T. Weber, 56, Bismarck, passed away on September 24, 2009, at Medcenter One after losing the battle with esophageal cancer. It was Kurt's wish to help others by donating his body to UND School of Medicine. A memorial service will be held on Friday, October 2, at 4:00 PM at Parkway Funeral Service, 2330 Tyler Parkway, Bismarck, with Rev. John Guthrie officiating. Kurt was born on May 4, 1953, in Mandan, ND, to Clement and Dolores Glaser Weber. He attended schools in Mandan and Bismarck and received his diploma from Bismarck High School in 1971. He then attended Bismarck Junior College but found his career with the railroad. He was an employee of the Soo Line Railroad and the Canadian Pacific for over thirty years where he received numerous safety awards. Kurt loved to play trivia while enjoying a cold one. He enjoyed telling people about North Dakota history and stories he heard while working on the railroad from the locals in small towns. His favorite hobby was working in his shop full of tools, creating stereo speaker boxes for his family and friends. He is survived by his parents, Clem and Dee Weber of Bismarck; three sisters, Sharon Ed Casanova of Brea, CA, Sylvia Gary Timms of Placentia, CA, and Maria Roger Schlecht of Bismarck; his niece, Gina Bobby Harmston and their daughter, Keili; his nephews, Victor Casanova and Jordan Roll; and numerous aunts, uncles, and cousins.
