Leo Raymond Steinert, 83, Bismarck, formerly of Regan, passed lovingly into the arms of Jesus, Sunday, March 17, 2013. Services will be held at 2:00 pm Thursday, March 21, at Evangel Assembly, Bismarck, with Rev. Doug Graham officiating. Burial will be in Sunset Memorial Gardens, Bismarck.

Visitation will be held from 5:00 pm – 8:00 pm Wednesday at Eastgate Funeral Service, Bismarck, where a prayer service will begin at 7:00 pm.

Visitation will continue one hour prior to the service at the church. Leo was born January 19, 1930, on a farm north of Regan, ND, the son of William and Annie Hochhalter Steinert. He was raised and educated northwest of Regan. In 1956, Leo married the love of his life, Beatrice Meyer, at the Regan Assembly of God Church. In his early years of farming, Leo also worked for Yegen Dairy southeast of Bismarck. Leo and Bea lived on several farms north of Regan before settling on the Art Meyer farm southeast of Regan where they resided for 48 years. There they raised their four children. Leo was a faithful servant of the Lord and active member of Regan Assembly, having served as a Sunday School teacher and Deacon. Leo enjoyed all aspects of farming, especially working with his cattle and making hay. Leo will be remembered for his kind spirit, honesty, and love for his grandchildren and great-granddaughters.
