Leo Anton Wolf Sonny, 63, passed away Monday, May 27, 2013, at St. Alexis Medical Center due to natural causes. Services will be held at 12:00 Noon Thursday, May 30, at Church of St. Mary, Bismarck, with Rev. Msgr. Gene Lindemann officiating. Burial will be at 3:00 pm at the North Dakota Veterans Cemetery, Mandan. Visitation will be held from 5:00 pm – 9:00 pm Wednesday, May 29, at Parkway Funeral Service, 2330 Tyler Parkway, Bismarck, where a rosary/vigil will begin at 7:00 pm. Visitation will continue one hour prior to the service at the church. Leo was born July 10, 1949, to Leo and Alvina Wolf in Emmons County, North Dakota. Leo grew up in Bismarck, attending St. Mary's Grade School and St. Mary's Central High School, graduating high school in 1968. He entered active duty in the US Navy on June 30, 1969 and was released from active duty on January 29, 1975. Leo also spent 25 years in the US Army Reserve, including service in the 311th and 4226th US Army Reserve Hospitals. He served in Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm. Serving faithfully and honorably, Leo was retired from the United States Army Reserve on July 10, 2009. Leo also had been employed with TAXI 9000 faithfully for the past 33 years. Leo enjoyed the outdoors and the simple things in life. He thoroughly enjoyed sharing his "adult wisdom" with his nieces and nephews, who will miss him; holidays will never be the same. He will be dearly missed by his family and many friends.
