



Lloyd Hanson

October 12, 1916 - November 3, 2005

Lloyd W. Hanson, 89, formerly of Carrington, died Thursday, November 3, 2005, at his home in Bismarck. Funeral services will be Monday at Eastgate Funeral Service Chapel with Rev. Kerry Stastny and Rev. Ted Bader officiating. Burial will be at ND Veteran's Cemetery in Mandan. Visitation will be Monday one hour prior to the service at the funeral home. Lloyd Hanson was born on October 12, 1916, on a farm near Turtle Lake, to James and Emma Sommars Hanson. He attended the Ingersol School in Veeder Township and graduated from Turtle Lake High School in 1933. In 1935, he moved to Carrington to work as a coal hauler for his brother-in-law's coal company. He also did some farm work in the Carrington area and worked as a mechanic for the local John Deere dealership. In December 1941, he began working for the United States Post Office in Carrington, a position he held for the following 39 years. Shortly after starting work at the Post Office, Lloyd was drafted in the U.S. Army and spent 30 months working at an ordnance plant near Camp Kilmer, New Jersey. He returned to Carrington following his discharge from the Army in 1944 and resumed work at the Post Office. He was promoted to city letter carrier in 1949 and promoted again to the position of mail clerk. He retired from the United States Postal Service in 1980. Lloyd married Edith Olson on August 2, 1941, in Carrington. They had one son. Edith died in 1984. Lloyd married Lorraine Hall of Carrington on October 11, 1986, and the couple moved to Bismarck. Lloyd enjoyed travel and gardening and was interested in current events. He served as a Boy Scout leader and in

many leadership positions in the Carrington Federated Church. He is survived by his wife, Lorraine of Bismarck; his son and daughter-in-law, Gary Lloyd and LuEtt Hanson of Ravenna, Ohio; and his sister, Elsie Adkins. He was preceded in death by his parents; his first wife, Edith; and his sisters, Ruby Forsberg and Luella Maude Oliver.
