



Lloyd Miller

July 23, 1915 - April 4, 2005

Lloyd E. Miller, 89, Bismarck, died at his home April 4, 2005. Services will be held at 11:00 a.m., Friday, at McCabe United Methodist Church, Bismarck, with the Rev. Rick Fossum officiating. Burial will be in Sunset Memorial Gardens. Visitation will be from 5:00 to 9:00 p.m. Thursday at Eastgate Funeral Service and one hour prior to the service at the church. Lloyd was born July 23, 1915 in Genoa City, Wisconsin, the son of William and Minnie Lindhammer Miller. His dad died in 1918 when Lloyd was only three years old. He and his sister lived with his grandmother for a time. His mother, Minnie, moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin with Lloyd and his sister and ran a boarding house. She married Andrew Bertsch while living there. He was from Bismarck originally and they returned here in 1920. In 1921, they moved to a farm north of Bismarck. Lloyd attended Arnold School. While quite young he farmed for his stepfather and mother and continued doing that until his marriage. He married Grace Williams on March 7, 1942, and then took over the farming operation. He was a member of McCabe United Methodist Church. He enjoyed hunting and fishing. He and his wife did a lot of camping with friends. They belonged to a square dance club in Bismarck for many years. They went on a lot of bus trips and visited every state in the union. He was Arnold 4-H Club leader for several years, assessor for Burnt Creek, Riverview and Naughton Townships for many years, and served on the Burnt Creek School Board. He was a lifetime member of the Eagles Club. He and his wife moved into Bismarck in 1990 and have lived at the Waterford on West Century since

September 7, 2002. Lloyd is survived by his wife, Grace; three sons and their wives, Clifford and Karen of Danville, Kentucky, Keith and Jeanette of Bozeman, Montana, and Neil and Clarice of Garrison, North Dakota; four grandchildren, Carrie Wertheimer and her husband Dan, Sarah Miller, Amber Miller and Ryan Miller; two great-grandsons, Will and Drew Wertheimer; and a sister, Auriol Robert McCarl. We will all miss him. He was our beloved and cherished husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather. Memorials may be given to the McCabe United Methodist Church Building Fund.
