Lyle Christensen, 76, Bismarck, passed away on August 29, 2008, at Medcenter One. Funeral services will be held on Wednesday at 11:00 AM at Faith Lutheran Church in Bismarck with Rev. Wes Aardahl officiating. Burial will be at Tuttle Cemetery. Visitation will be Tuesday from 3:00 – 9:00 PM at Eastgate Funeral and Cremation Service and will continue Wednesday one hour prior to the service at the church. Lyle was born on October 11, 1931, in Tuttle, ND. He was the second child in a family of eight. He grew up in Tuttle and received his first twelve years of schooling there. He then attended Valley City State Teacher's College and Wahpeton State School of Science. Lyle was drafted into the U.S. Army at the time of the Korean War in 1952 and served overseas duty in Korea. He received his honorable discharge in 1953. He then returned to Tuttle and farmed for several years. In 1964, Lyle moved to Bismarck where he worked for various businesses including Kirschmann Manufacturing and Sweetheart Bakery, and later performed maintenance for Bismarck Airport for twenty years. He retired in 1994. He was a life-time member of the VFW. In 1968, he married Sharon Fischer in Bismarck. They had one daughter, Charlene, and they have three grandchildren. Lyle is survived by his wife, Sharon of Bismarck; his daughter, Charlene of Bismarck; his grandchildren, Michael Dickson and Kristen Dickson of Williston; his mother-in-law, Florence Fischer of Steele ; three brothers, Leonard of Bismarck, Ralph of Spokane, WA, and Vernal of Sioux Falls, SD; two sisters, Alice Wald of Billings, MT, and Laverne Wilson of Aberdeen, SD; and several

brothers-in-law, sisters-in-law, nieces, and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, Ted and Constance Christensen of Tuttle; two sisters, Ethel Hirschert of South Dakota, and Doris Rath of Montana; his father-in-law, Harold Fischer of Steele; and his grandson, Gregory Dickson of Williston.
