Marvin A. Krein, 75, Bismarck, went home to be with his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on December 10, 2007. Funeral services will be held on Saturday at 11:00 AM at Church of the Ascension in Bismarck with Rev. Marvin Klemmer officiating. Burial will be held on Monday at 10:00 AM at the ND Veteran's Cemetery. Visitation will be Friday from 2 PM - 9 PM at Eastgate Funeral Service where a prayer service will be held at 7:00 PM at the funeral home. Visitation will continue one hour prior to the service at the church. Marvin was born on February 10, 1932, at Lehr, ND, the son of William and Pauline Springer Krein. He grew up and attended schools in rural Kidder County. In 1953, he entered the U.S. Army, serving in Verdun, France, until 1955 when he was honorably discharged. He then moved to Bismarck and went to work for Western Concrete. On May 20, 1957, he married Min Knoll at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Bismarck. Min passed away on June 20, 1999. Marvin worked for Pius Halter Trucking, Royce Produce, and Consolidated Freight, retiring in 1995. On April 24, 2004, he married Mary Meier Burgad at Church of Corpus Christi in Bismarck. Marvin enjoyed traveling and was a true kid at heart and was known for his unique sense of humor. He was a loving, caring husband, father, grandfather, and brother and was always giving of himself to help someone else.
