Orland Lien, 80, Mandan, died at his home October 2, 2013. Services will be held on Monday at 10:30 AM at Parkway Funeral Service, 2330 Tyler Parkway, Bismarck. Burial will be at 1:00 PM at the ND Veterans Cemetery. Visitation will be held on Sunday from 4:00 – 7:00 PM at Parkway Funeral Service and will continue on Monday one hour prior to the service. Orland was born April 29, 1933, in Kidder County, ND, the son of Helge and Ruth Weld Lien. He entered the U.S. Army on June 5, 1953, at Ft. Sheridan and served during the Korean Conflict in Germany and was honorably discharged as a Corporal on May 7, 1955. Orland and Myrtle Neumiller were married on September 29, 1955, in Carrington, ND. They bought a farm south of Bowdon, ND, working and caring for the land with the highest of standards, raising their family there. As health issues developed, they retired from farming and moved to Mandan. Orland enjoyed working on sewing machines and driving the transit bus and courtesy cars for a time. Orland passed away in his own home surrounded by his family, supported by loyal friends and through it all always looking forward with hope in God, the same hope that was with him throughout his entire life. Orland is survived by his wife, Myrtle; his children, Darwin Lien of Mandan, Rhonda Bruce Weeda of Wahpeton, and Rocklyn Stephanie Lien of Clayton, NC; his grandchildren, Jamie Lien Jimmy, fiancée, Kayla Lien, Jordan Heidi Weeda, Amy Brad Benjamin, Grace Lien, and Emily Lien; his great-grandchildren, Tristen and Collin, Elle and Aryn, Oliver and Henry; one brother, Lester Linda Lien of Harvey, ND; and his nieces,
