Oscar Lapp, 85, Bismarck, died July 15, 2011, at his home. Visitation will be Wednesday from 10:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. followed by a brief service at Eastgate Funeral Service, 2302 E. Divide Avenue, Bismarck, with Rev. Gary Heaton presiding. Burial will follow at Fairview Cemetery. Oscar was born on March 16, 1926, north of Zap, ND, the son of Peter and Julia Kutzka Lapp. He was raised and attended school north of Zap. He served with the U.S. Navy for almost two years and farmed north of Zap until 1963. He married Betty Kraft on October 6, 1963. They moved to Bismarck where Oscar worked for the post office from 1964 - 1989. Upon his retirement from the US Postal Service, he built his and Betty's dream home on the bank of the Missouri River near Bismarck where they lived for nineteen years. They moved into Bismarck in 2007 when Oscar became ill. Oscar is survived by his wife, Betty of Bismarck; daughters, Diane Lapp of Bismarck and Lynnette Alvin Crouch of Burlington, ND; granddaughter, Trina Patrick Gilhooly; great-grandson, Rylan Patrick Gilhooly; brother, Richard Lapp of Pendleton, OR; sister, Lora Saul of Muscatine, IA; sister-in-law, Carol Chester of Madison, MN; and many nieces and nephews.
