



Robert "Bob" Snow

December 11, 1946 - September 20, 2009

Robert "Bob" Snow, 62, Bismarck, passed away peacefully on September 20, 2009, at Medcenter One Hospital. Services will be held at 11:30 am Thursday at Parkway Funeral Service, 2330 Tyler Parkway, Bismarck, with Rev. Gary Heaton officiating. Burial will be held at 2:00 pm at the North Dakota Veteran's Cemetery, Mandan. Visitation will be held from 4:00 pm until 9:00 pm Wednesday at Parkway Funeral Service, with a Masonic service beginning at 7:00 pm. Visitation will continue one hour prior to the service at the funeral home. Bob was born December 11, 1946, in Bismarck, ND, the son of Raymond L. and Shirley D. Nagel Snow. He grew-up and attended Roosevelt Grade School and Bismarck High School. Bob entered the US Army in 1964, serving in Germany, and was honorably discharged in 1969. He returned to Bismarck to run Bob's Shoe Repair. Bob was always a cowboy at heart, being involved in a horseman's club. He loved the outdoors, and enjoyed hunting, fishing, golfing, and working with wood. Bob was a lifelong member of the Hazen Masonic Lodge #116 and the Bismarck Masonic Lodge #5; he served as the Master of the Hazen Lodge in 1989. Bob was involved in law enforcement in Hazen and Solen, and most recently worked for Bismarck Parks and Rec at the McDowell Dam. Bob is survived by his mother, Shirley Schweigert, Bismarck; his sister, Diane Karry Benfiet, Lincoln, ND; his nephews, Beau and Brett Benfiet; special step-brother, Doug Schweigert; aunt, Ella Nagel, St. Paul, MN; his cousin, Lynn Christen; his long-time friends, Lane and Laurie Olson; and the Russel Johnson family and children.

He was preceded in death by his father, Raymond.
