Rollie T. Johnson, 100, Bismarck, formerly of Litchville, died March 13, 2007. Services will be held at 11 AM Saturday at First Lutheran Church, Litchville, ND, with the Rev. Darrell Schultz officiating. Spring burial will be held in the Litchville Cemetery. Visitation will be held from 4-9 PM Friday at Eastgate Funeral Service and will continue one hour prior to the service at the church. Rollie TenPas Johnson was born July 10, 1906, in Ripon, WI to Henry and Minie TenPas. She lived in her home in Litchville until three years ago making her home with her son and daughter-in-law, Jerry and Diann Johnson of Bismarck. Until moving to Bismarck, she became a snow bird and spent her winters in Las Vegas. She was a member of First Lutheran Church in Litchville and enjoyed quilting with her friends every Tuesday.
