Rueby Dale McCabe, 88, Bismarck, died February 26, 2007, at a Bismarck hospital. Services will be held at 10:30 am Thursday at First Presbyterian Church with Rev. Vicky Rucker officiating. Burial will be in Sunset Memorial Gardens, Bismarck. Visitation will be held from 2:00 pm until 7:30 pm Wednesday at Eastgate Funeral Service, Bismarck, and continue one hour prior to services at the church.
