Sheldon Oremland, 80, Bismarck, died at his home on Sunday, April 8, 2007. Services will be held at 2:00 pm Thursday at Eastgate Funeral Service Chapel, Bismarck, with Rev. Darrel Aleson officiating. Burial will be in Fairview Cemetery, Bismarck. Visitation will be held from 4:00 pm until 8:00 pm on Wednesday at Eastgate Funeral Service, Bismarck. Sheldon was born on August 10, 1926, in Washington, D.C., the son of Gertrude and Joseph Oremland. He graduated from Montgomery Junior College, Bethesda, MD, in 1948. That same year he was named to the first team National Junior College football team by the president of the National Junior College Athletic Association. He attended Georgetown University in Washington, D.C. and graduated from the School of Foreign Service in 1952. On July 30, 1949, he married Sally Anderson at St. John's Church in Forest Glen, MD. They lived in Silver Spring, MD, until 1955 when he became a sales representative for Mobil Oil Company in Aberdeen, SD. Sheldon was employed with Mobil Oil for 28 years moving from Aberdeen to Crosby, ND, then to Bismarck, Red Lake Falls, MN, then back to Bismarck in 1972 as a territory manager for Mobil Oil. In 1992, Sheldon was inducted into the Montgomery College, Rockville, MD, Hall of Fame for his performance in football, basketball, and baseball while a student there. Sheldon was an avid sportsman. He played softball and golf in his younger years. Recently, he has devoted a lot of time to fantasy football, basketball, and golf. His greatest pleasure was an annual fishing trip with his fishing friends. Sheldon is survived by his wife, Sally; his niece, Mrs. Jeri

Minutillo of Madison, CT; his sister and brother-in-law, Nance and James Butler of Phoenix, AZ; and his sister-in-law, Judith Youngstrom Ray of Boise, ID.
