Steven Theodore Nagel, 60, Mandan, passed away at his home surrounded by his loving family on March 25, 2015, after his courageous fight with cancer.

The funeral service will be held at 11:00 am Monday, March 30, at House of Prayer Lutheran Church, 1470 S Washington St. Bismarck with Pastor Joel Samuelson officiating. Burial will be held at Mandan Union Cemetery.

Visitation will be held from 5:00 to 7:00 pm Sunday, March 29, at Parkway Funeral Service, 2320 Tyler Parkway, Bismarck, where a prayer service will begin at 7:00 pm.

Steve was born April 6, 1954, to Ted and Joyce (Dutton / Anderson) Nagel in Bismarck. He graduated from St. Mary's High School in 1972. Steve met the love of his life, Karen Marcotte, while camping at Lake Sakakawea. On June 1, 1985, they had a beautiful outdoor wedding in Fargo. The special love that Steve and Karen shared shined through for all to see. They were a fairytale couple come true.

Steve opened Mandan Auto Glass in 1986. It was an exciting venture to start his own business after working in the glass industry for years. Randy Berger later joined him in a partnership in the business.

Steve's number one priority has always been family. When his father passed away in 1974, Steve took on the role of big brother seriously. His weekend adventures always included his mom and six younger siblings. Steve was very close to Karen's family spending holidays and vacations together. He loved having his children and grandchildren come to the farm to play.

Steve truly was an outdoor person. He enjoyed camping, fishing, ice fishing, hunting, snowmobiling, kayaking, scuba diving, riding Harley with his wife Karen and their Harley group, flying his powered parachute and too many other things to mention. He enjoyed watching the birds and made sure his bird feeders were always full. He loved to build or fix

Steve's fun loving, high energy personality made him exciting to be around. He had many great friends that he valued. Steve was a regular visitor to Karen's elementary school classroom. He loved to bring the children some kind of treat.

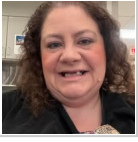
