Trevor "TJ" Lucier, 19, Bismarck, died August 29, 2009. Services will be held at 10:00 am Saturday at Zion Lutheran Church, Bismarck, with Rev. Thomas R. Marcis Jr., officiating. Visitation will be held from 3:00 pm until 9:00 pm Friday at Parkway Funeral Service, 2330 Tyler Parkway, Bismarck, where a prayer service will begin at 7:00 pm. Trevor Jay Lucier was born on December 8, 1989, in Bismarck, ND, the son of Cari Fischer and John III Lucier. He attended Jeannette Myhre Elementary School, Wachter Middle School, and graduated from Bismarck High School in May 2008. Trevor was baptized on January 14, 1990, and confirmed on April 25, 2004, at Zion Lutheran Church. Growing up Trevor spent a lot of time with his grandpa, grandma, and Aunt Heather. There were many times when they were out camping, his grandpa would wake-up and Trevor wouldn't be in his bed; he would be out fishing. Early on in his life, Trevor's grandma gave him a nickname that she called him to this day, "the Charlie Brown", his friends would call him, "Lucy". From the age of 14, Trevor had worked at Burger King South, Cash Wise, Super Kids, Arrow Services, and Knife River. He attended college at BSC and had been talking about moving to another state to see what was out there. Last fall, Trevor received a boat that had belonged to his great-uncle and he was taking great pride in restoring it. Trevor loved to go fishing, boating, snowboarding, jet skiing, and motorcycle riding with his friends. Trevor loved his music and made sure everyone could hear it. Trevor spent many good times with his brother and sister; he would pick up his

brother, Brandon, and take him out shopping and let him drive his Jeep, his sister, Ciara, enjoyed going to her brother's apartment to watch movies together and just laughing with each other. Trevor was always there for his family and friends and he will be deeply loved and missed by all who knew him. "Don't cry because it's over, smile because it happened."
